# R. Donald Harvey, PharmD FCCP FHOPA BCOP 2018 Award of Excellence

The Award of Excellence recognizes a member who has made a significant, sustained contribution to or provided excellent leadership in improving or supporting hematology/oncology pharmacy.

Donald Harvey is an Associate Professor in the Department of Hematology and Medical Oncology in the School of Medicine and Director of the Phase I Clinical Trials Section at the Winship Cancer Institute of Emory University. He obtained his BS and PharmD degrees at the University of North Carolina (UNC) and completed pharmacy practice and hematology oncology residencies at the University of Kentucky and UNC, respectively. His research in anticancer early drug development focuses on the application of clinical pharmacology principles to improved patient care, and he has been principal or co-investigator on over 50 phase I and clinical pharmacology trials since joining Emory in 2009 and has over 60 peer reviewed publications. Organ dysfunction, drug interaction, food effects, and pharmacology and hematology and hematology/oncology professional organizations including ASCO, ASCPT, and ASH and is Chair of the Research Committee and a Past President of HOPA.

## Alexandra Shillingburg, PharmD BCOP 2018 New Practitioner Award

The New Practitioner Award recognizes a member early in his or her career who has made a notable contribution to developing or supporting clinical hematology/oncology pharmacy services.

Alexandra Shillingburg is a Bone Marrow Transplantation Pharmacist Clinical Coordinator at the Levine Cancer Institute through the Carolinas Healthcare System in Charlotte, North Carolina. Before that, Alex Director of Stem Cell Collection and Apheresis Program and the Alexander B. Osoborn Hematopoietic Malignancy and Transplantation Program at the West Virginia University Cancer Institute. She has been cited in many journals with topics focusing around hematology, oncology, clinical trials, pathology, and pediatrics.
