**Ryan Bookout, PharmD BCOP BCPS,

Chicago, IL (March 21, 2018): Ryan Bookout, PharmD BCOP BCPS, took office as the President of the Hematology/Oncology Pharmacy Association (HOPA) at the recent 14th HOPA Annual Conference in March. Dr. Bookout has been an active member of HOPA since 2007 and recently served as Member at Large on the Board of Directors, as Board Liaison to the HOPA Committee Restructuring Task Force, and most recently, as President-elect during the 2017–2018 term. He has dedicated much time and expertise to HOPA, including serving on the BCOP Recertification Committee, HOPA RFP Lobbying Task Force, and the Council on Continuing Education.

Dr. Bookout received his Bachelor's in Chemistry from Wake Forest University and his Doctor of Pharmacy Degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He completed his PGY1 Pharmacy Practice Residency and his PGY2 Oncology Pharmacy Practice Residency at the University Hospital- Health Alliance of Greater Cincinnati (now the University Of Cincinnati Medical Center- UC Health). He has been a Board Certified Oncology Pharmacist since 2006 and a Board Certified Pharmacotherapy Specialist since 2011.
